

- Background - 1960's & 70's - Disillusionment with political & social turmoil + rise of poverty, unemployment, racism, conflicts, & social turmoil, geopolitical conflict, Vietnam & Korean War



- Anti Capitalism & Anti Market system
- Radical geo - encouraged Revolutionary approaches & violent struggle to address inequality.
- It focused on workers rights & blamed Capitalism & class division responsible for Exploitation



- Radical geo focused on spatial inequalities as a consequence of historical exploitation systems
- Solution - violent overthrow of existing political & social institutions & control and ownership of resources
